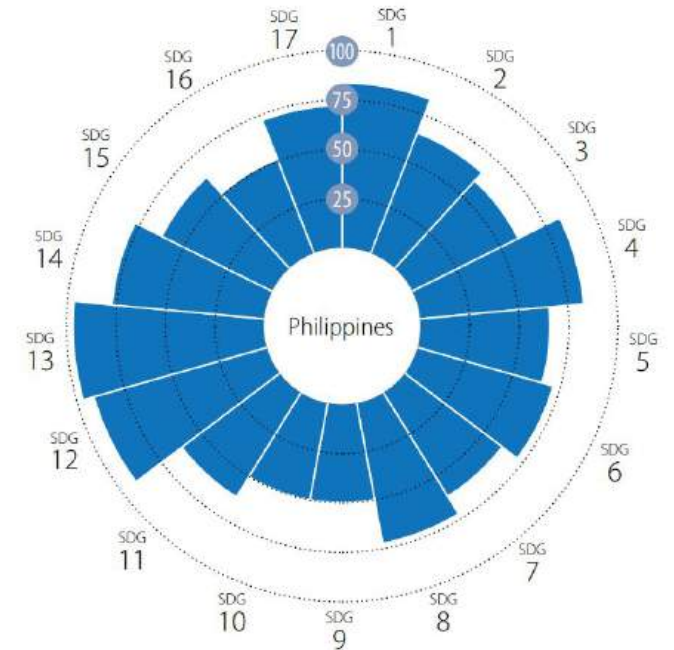

Nutrition & Stunting

23.6% of Filipino children under age 5 are **stunted***

**Impaired growth and development*

Learning & Literacy

24.83 million or **29.2%** of Filipinos aged 10-64 are **not functionally literate***

Cannot read, write, compute, **and comprehend*

Climate Change

Philippines has been the **most at-risk*** country in the world for 16 consecutive years

**Most exposure to natural disasters and inability to cope/adapt*

Poverty

17.54 million or **15.5%** of Filipinos were **poor*** in 2023.
